This privacy policy sets out how the Australian Association of Social Marketing Inc. (hereafter referred to as "AASM") uses and protects any information that you give AASM when you use this website.

AASM is committed to ensuring that your privacy is protected. Should we ask you to provide certain information by which you can be identified when using this website, then you can be assured that it will only be used in accordance with this privacy statement.

What we collect

We may collect the following information:

- Name;
- Contact information including email address and phone; and
- Usage tracking with industry-standard Google analytics.

What we do with the information we gather

We require this information to understand your needs and provide you with a better service, and in particular for the following reasons:

- Internal record keeping;
- We may use the information to improve our products and services; and
- We may periodically send promotional emails about new services, special
 offers or other information which we think you may find interesting using
 the email address which you have provided, only if you have given us
 permission.

Security

We are committed to ensuring that your information is secure. In order to prevent unauthorized access or disclosure, we have put in place suitable physical, electronic and managerial procedures to safeguard and secure the information we collect online.

What is a cookie?

Cookies are text files containing small amounts of information which are downloaded to your device when you visit a website. Cookies are then sent back to the originating website on each subsequent visit, or to another website that recognizes that cookie. Cookies are useful because they allow a website to recognise a user's device. You can find more information about cookies at:

Cookies do lots of different jobs, like letting you navigate between pages efficiently, remembering your preferences, and generally improving the user experience. They can also help to ensure that advertisements you see online are more relevant to you and your interests.

Category 1: strictly necessary cookies

These cookies are essential in order to enable you to move around the website and use its features, such as accessing secure areas of the website. Without these cookies, services you have asked for, like shopping baskets or members-only sections, cannot be provided.

Category 2: performance cookies

These cookies collect information about how visitors use a website, for instance which pages visitors go to most often, and if they get error messages from web pages. These cookies do not collect information that identifies a visitor. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous. It is only used to improve how a website works. By using our website, you agree that we can place these types of cookies on your device.

Category 3: functionality cookies

These cookies allow the website to remember choices you make (such as your username, language, or the region you are in) and provide enhanced, more personal features. These cookies can also be used to remember changes you have made to text size, fonts, and other parts of web pages that you can customize. They may also be used to provide services you have asked for such as watching a video or commenting on a blog. The information these cookies collect may be anonymized and they cannot track your browsing activity on other websites. By using our website, you agree that we can place these types of cookies on your device.

Links to other websites

Controlling your personal information

We aim to remain GDPR compliant.

You have:

- The right to be informed: That is what this page is for!
- The right of access: Individuals will have the right to ask—and receive an answer—if an organization is processing their data. This information must be provided largely for free within one month of request.

- The right to rectification: If your data is incorrect or incomplete, you have the right to have it corrected.
- The right to be forgotten: You may request the removal of your data, for example from our mailing list if you have signed up to it.
- The right to restrict processing: Under certain circumstances, you can block the processing of your personal data, although on this site, it would mean just not providing any and opting out of Google Analytics (see links below).
- The right to data portability: You can use your own data anywhere you like.
- The right to object: You can object to the use of your personal data for most purposes.

You may choose to restrict the collection or use of your personal information in the following ways:

- If you have previously agreed to us using your personal information for direct marketing purposes, you may change your mind at any time by writing to or emailing us, if it is not obvious how to delete your own data.
- Opting out of Google Analytics

We will not sell, distribute, or lease your personal information to third parties (unless we have your permission, but currently have no plans in this area) or are required by law to do so. We may use your personal information to send you promotional information about third parties which we think you may find interesting, but again, only if you tell us that you wish this to happen.

You may request details of personal information which we hold about you. This is normally free and we aim to respond within one month.
